

La Gazzetta del Popolo

135 years of history, journalism and culture

La Gazzetta del Popolo was a Turin-based daily that told Italian news from 1848 to 1983. The exhibition illustrates the years 1916-1945 of the Turin newspaper.

It intends to make new generations discover what *La Gazzetta del Popolo* was, from a leading newspaper of the Risorgimento to the position in the fascist years, from the post-war period to the difficult years of self-management, until its final closure in 1983.

It had an important cultural page, "Diorama letterario", on which the most important Italian and European intellectuals of the time wrote.

On show the thematic supplements, the satirical cartoons and the pages of the children section as well as the cultural pages of "Diorama letterario". The visitor will also see a video with interviews of several journalists and typographers and the historical images granted by the RAI showcases.
